Section 12A-26(e)(2) of the Dallas City Code provides:

If the preliminary finding is that the complaint does not state a claim under this chapter or does not have just cause, based upon the statements and evidence submitted, the complaint must be dismissed. A determination that a complaint be dismissed can only be made upon the affirmative vote of at least two of the three preliminary panel members. Written notice of the dismissal must be sent to both the person who

made the complaint and the person about whom the complaint was made, identifying the reason or reasons for dismissal.

Section 12A-27(a) of the Dallas City Code provides:

(a) <u>Evidentiary hearing</u>. If a complaint is not summarily dismissed under Section 12A-26(e), it will be pursued further at a hearing before the ethics advisory commission.
